

H. H. Achey

History of Buffalo County, Samuel Bassett, p. 118, 186, 193, 194, 276, 279

Oct. 132, 1872 – Vol. 1, No.1 Kearney Junction Times, L B. Cunningham, editor, lists H. H. Achey as a carpenter and builder. Harold House owners S. & J. Murphy, Nightengale & Keens (F.G.) druggists.

May 5, 1873 – first election in which Trustees [town council] members were chosen. Included was H. H. Achey, a contractor and builder

June 23, 1873 – Liquor licenses issued to James Kelly, Stimpson & Decker, H. H. Achey and A. J. Spaulding

December 3, 1873 – Kearney Junction incorporated as City of Kearney. Officials for Kearney Junction became the first city council of Kearney. This included H. H. Achey.

Homesteaded in Odessa Township in 1878.

The Acheys and Hostetlers were brothers-in-law according to the reminiscence of Mrs. Bastin. She says that they later moved to Kearney.

Aug. 19, 1876 - \$256 tighten all the rods & bolts in bridge across Platte south of K
\$286,66 for sidewalk
Sept. 2, 1876 - Contracted with County Commissioners to build a wagon bridge across
the South Loup on road 29 in Section 35-12-15 for \$781.25 [at present day Poole]
Jan. 1877 – Contracted with county to build a bridge near Erastus Smith (homestead S ½
NE ¼ 8-12-14) Also across Beaver Creek on road 29 [Ravenna]
May 1877 – Paid Achey \$33.50 for road work
June 1877 – Bridge work
July 1877 – \$262 + \$80 for bridge work

Oct. 1877 - \$18 for work

Oct. 20, 1877 – Paid for work on K bridge
