1. Name of School - Pleasanton High School
2. County and District Number - Buffalo County Dist. #105
3. Location - Pleasanton, NE, up on the hill
4. Years of operation - District organized Oct. 8, 1890 as a grade school. Grade 10 was added in 1912; expanded to a 4-year high school in 1922 (still open)
5. School colors - **Red and white**
6. School Mascot - **Bulldog**

8. Year of first graduating class - 1913 (10th grade) 1923 (12th grade)
Number in class - 1913 - 3 graduates; 1923 - 9 graduates
Names of members first graduating class - 1913 graduates from the 10th grade were Anna Grammer Geisler, Bertha Reese, and Walter Reese. Grace Gilbert and Julia Harre attended with this class but did not graduate.
1923 graduates from the 12th grade were Harvey Grammer, Earl Eaton, Minnie Lammers Beckman, Bernice Zbinden Hoffman, Isabelle Eaton Phillips, Alfred Hadwiger, and Eletha Swearingen Cloris Hansberry.
The class of 1923 were the first to wear caps and gowns at their graduation. They graduated four times - from the eighth grade, from the ninth grade, from the tenth grade and from the twelfth grade.
