Profiles of Players Acquired by Trade



Soren Jonzzon – Forward, 5’9”, 170, 12-10-1991

Soren is from Mountain View, California, in the San Francisco Bay area. The city is in the Silicon Valley and is the home of Google, Symantec, & Inuit.

By the time Soren was 13 he was playing AA Midget hockey. The next season he moved up to the Jr. Sharks AAA Midget team. He worked with a power skating coach for nine years. In the summer of 2008 he participated in the Select 17 Player Development Camp. Then he went to the NAHL to skate for the St. Louis Bandits in the 2008-09 season.

Soren spent last season with the Waterloo Black Hawks. In May, during the Entry Draft he was traded to Tri-City for a fourth round draft pick.

Soren attended tryout camp and made the cut to be on the All-Star roster.

Kevin Lind – Defense, 6’3”, 200, 3-31-1992

Kevin comes from Homer Glen, Illinois, a relatively newly incorporated suburb southwest of Chicago. His hockey playing experience includes Team Illinois, AAA Pee Wee, and Team USA twice. He only played a couple of months for the Chicago Mission Major Midgets before joining the Steel for the 2008-09 season. Last season he represented the Steel as a member of the East Division team in the USHL All-Star team.



Kevin was part of the trade with the Chicago Steel for the first overall draft pick. He attended tryout camp and made it through cuts to the All-Star roster. He has committed to Notre Dame.

NHL Draft --- There are now three Tri-City players who may be selected in the upcoming NHL draft. **Jaden Schwartz**, of course, we have been following all this past season. In the recent trades and draft two more candidates have been acquired. **Kevin Lind** comes to us from Chicago as part of The Trade. **Brian Ward** was our first Entry Draft pick.



Zack Rall – Defense, 6’0”, 192, 4-18-1992

Zack Rall is another of the players acquired from Chicago for the number one overall pick in the Entry Draft.

Zack comes from Anchorage Alaska. While at home he

attended South Anchorage High School. He graduated from high school this past spring.

In Anchorage Zack played for the Alaska All Stars midget team then he went to the Chicago Steel last season. He has committed to the U of Alaska at Anchorage, starting in the 2011 or 2012 season.

T. J. Sarcona – Forward, 5’10”, 170, 6-1-1992

TJ is from West Islip on the south shore of Long Island, New York.

He played in the New Jersey Rockets program for four years. A year ago he was drafted by the Chicago Steel and placed on their Affiliate list. He was called up to play three games for them in December.

TJ comes to the Storm as part of the trade for the first overall pick in the Entry Draft. He attended tryout camp and made it to the All-Star roster.



Cory Czarnik – Forward, 5’10”, 155, 10-29-1993

Cory is from Washington, Michigan, a community on the north edge of the Detroit metropolitan area. He was selected by Chicago a year

ago in the Futures Draft. He played two games for the Steel last season.

Cory played the 2008-09 season on the Belle Tire U16 team and the 2009-10 season for Honey Baked U18 Major Midgets. His record as a goal scorer goes back to age 11.

He was part of the pre-draft trade of the #1 draft selection position. His older brother, Robbie, is currently on the U. of Michigan hockey team

Cory attended tryout camp and made the cut to be included on the All-Star roster.



Entry Draft Selections



Brian Ward – Forward, 6'0", 191, 2-14-1992

Brian Ward was the Storm's first draft pick. He is from Haverhill, MA. He was the top rookie on his team in his freshman

year at Haverhill High School. Then he transferred to Governor's Academy where he just completed his junior year. Brian was named to the First Team in the Independent School League and received his team's MVP award.

Brian has committed to play for Dartmouth in 2011. He attended tryout camp and made the cuts to advance to the All-Star roster.



Dominic Panetta – 5'9", 160, Forward, 4-25-1991

Dominic's status information gives Baldwin, Michigan, north of Grand Rapids, as his hometown.

But in an interview last year he said he grew up in Big Rapids. The two are not far apart.

Last season Dominic played for the Bismarck Bobcats in the NAHL.

Dominic has committed to Ferris State, located in Big Rapids, for the 2011-12 season. His plans are to study Green Technology while he plays hockey there.

Dominic attended tryout camp and made the cut to be included on the All-Star roster.



William (Bill) Eiserman – Defense, 5'11", 194, 7-21-1992

Bill is from Newburyport, MA, a small city on the coast just north of Boston. He played for the New

Hampshire Monarchs in the Eastern Junior Hockey League, a travel team located in Hooksett, NH. He was a member of the 2009 USA U18 select team which competed in Slovakia last August.

In July 2009 Bill was the first to commit to play for UMass-Lowell in 2011.

Bill attended tryout camp and made the cut to be on the All-Star roster.



Brad Schierhorn – Forward, 6'0", 165, 11-3-1992

Brad is also from Anchorage, Alaska, where he attended South Anchorage High School. As a freshman in 2008 he scored the winning

goal in double overtime to bring his Wolverines their 4th straight state championship at their level.

Brad played last season for the Detroit Belle Tire Major Midget U18 team. He was drafted by the Kenai River Brown Bears in the NAHL last month as well as by the Tri-city Storm.

Brad attended tryout camp and made it to the All-Star roster.

Ryan Sproul – Defense, 6'2", 172, 1-13-1993

Ryan Sproul is a Canadian from Mississauga, Ontario, which is part of the Greater Toronto Metro Area.



He was drafted by the Soo Greyhounds of the Ontario Hockey League a year ago. During the 2009-10 season Ryan was a member of the Vaughan Kings in the Greater Toronto Hockey League.

In May Ryan attended the Soo Greyhounds Prospect Orientation Camp. He also attended the Tri-City tryout camp and survived the cut to be included on the All-Star roster.

Shane Walsh – Forward, 180, 5'11", 12-1-1991

Shane comes from West Roxbury, a Boston suburb, where he attended Catholic Memorial, a private all-boys school.



During his first three high school years Shane played on the Catholic Memorial hockey team. Then last season he played for the South Shore Kings in the Eastern Junior Hockey League. Shane has committed to the University of Massachusetts in 2011.

He did not attend tryout camp.

Davey Middleton– Forward, 6’3”, 190, 5-21-1992
 Davey is from Novi, Michigan, which is about half way between Detroit and Ann Arbor. He graduated this spring from Novi Detroit Catholic Central High School, one of four private schools which dominate hockey in the area. His school won the state championship in their Division 1 level this year.

Davey attended tryout camp and made the cut to be included on the roster for the All-Star game.



Kevin Tansey – Defense, 6’1”, 195, 2-22-1993

Kevin Tansey is from Hammond, Ontario, directly east of Ottawa. He attends St. Francis Xavier High School in Hammond and plays soccer as well as hockey.

A year ago he was drafted by the Cumberland Grads, in the Ottawa metro area. This spring Kevin committed to play for Clarkson University in the 2011-12 or 2012-13 season.

He did not attend the Tri-City tryout camp.

Scott Diebold – Goalie, 6’, 150, 7-15-1992

Scott was the only goalie drafted this season. He is from West Seneca, New York. He attended St. Francis High School in Athol Springs on the shore of Lake Erie south of Buffalo. He will be a senior this year.

An assistant coach/goalie coach at St. Francis is also Scott Diebold, an ’85 graduate of that school who played hockey for Canisius College. Are they related?

Scott attended tryout camp and made the cut to be included on the All-Star roster.



Anthony Olguin – Forward, 5’9”, 160, 1-13-1994

Anthony is from Pueblo, Colorado. For the past two seasons he has played for the Pikes Peak Miners, first on a

Bantam AAA team and then the U16 team last season.

In the Challenge Cup International AAA Championship Showcase tournament held annually in Vancouver, British Columbia, Anthony attended the 2009 event. He was one of the scoring leaders with 9 goals.

He also attended the USHL Prospect Combine held in May before the Futures and Entry Drafts. Anthony also attended the Storm tryout camp.

Michael Vecchione– Forward, 5’10”, 170, 2-25-1993

Michael’s home is in Saugus, Massachusetts, in the Greater Boston area. He has been attending Malden Catholic High School for the past three years where he plays



baseball along with hockey.

Michael is described as a “top player on one of the top teams in the state of Massachusetts.” He was awarded the MVP trophy in their Christmas tournament. In April Michael committed to the University of New Hampshire.

He did not attend tryout camp.

Brett Findlay – Forward, 5’11”, 160, 10-13-1992

Brett is from Echo Bay, Ontario, east of Sault St. Marie. He spent the 2008-9 season with the AA Midget Cambrian Nissan Titans and last season with the Blind River Beavers in the



Northern Ontario Hockey Association at the Jr. A level where he was named Rookie of the Year.

Brett did not attend tryout camp.

Tyler Hope – Forward, 5’10”, 170, 7-12-1992

Tyler is a Texan now from McKinney, north of Dallas /Ft. Worth but he was born in Overland Park, KS, which is in the Kansas City area.



During this past hockey season Tyler played for the Dallas Stars AAA team Before that he played for the Dallas Junior Penguins U16 AAA team. Tyler attended tryout camp and made the cut to be placed on the All-Star roster.
