Futures Draft

The Futures Draft was held on April 19, 2011. The order of picks was made by a random drawing in which the Storm drew the eighth position. A couple of trades with Cedar Rapids resulted in earlier or later selection positions in some rounds.

Players with 1995 birth dates were chosen this year. Each team got six choices. The Tri-City Storm chose the following six players:

Records Broken, Records Tied

Team Records Broken

The two team records set this season were for the most overtime losses of five and the most shootout losses of six. The former records were overtime losses of four in 2000-01 and shootout losses of five in 2005-6. The individual records broken or tied were of a more positive nature.

Pinkston Breaks Record

Rick Pinkston may be gone, moving on to college this fall, but he will not be forgotten. He has left his name in the Storm record book. During the past season Rick set a new record for the most goals by a defenseman. His 18 goals were seven better than Brian Kilburg's 11, a record he set during the 2004-05 season.

Holden Breaks Record

During the Tri-City vs Sioux City game on Feb. 18, 2011 Chris Holden set one record and tied two others.

In one period he faced a record 29 shots on goal and made a record 28 saves. The previous record had been set in two separate games.

The first time was in the Dec. 18, 2005 game against Green Bay. Goalie Derek Brennan faced 25 shots and made 22 saves. That was in the first period of the game. In the second period

he faced no shots on goal and the Storm made only one shot on goal, by Kyle Lawson, who scored.

The second time was on Oct. 18, 2008, again against Sioux City. This time goalie Nick Hopper faced 25 shots and made 21 saves.

Records Tied

Chris Holden made 48 saves in that Feb 18 game. This tied a record set by T. J. Massie on Feb 21, 2009 when he faced a total of 51 shots. Holden faced 53 shots in the game which tied the Storm vs. Waterloo game on Dec. 13, 2008.

Scott Diebold tied the record of most goalie assists with two this season. This record is also held by T. J. Massie in 2008-09 and Carson Chubak in 2009-10.

Brad Shierhorn had two shorthanded goals in the second period of the Feb 18 game with Sioux City. This record is also held by former Storm players Chris Nathe, J. P. Platisha,

The Season in Review

Season Eleven

This was another season of close games. Ten were won by one point - five in regular time, two in overtime and three in shootouts. Sixteen games were lost by one point. Five were lost in regular time, five in overtime, a team record, and six in shootouts.

The outcome of 16 games, over one fourth of the games played this season, could not be decided in regular time. Seven games were decided in overtime and nine went to shootouts.
